Dear First Christian Church of the Beaches Family,

Recently God has put an issue on my heart. For the most part, I enjoy social media – the birthday notifications, photos of babies and pets, shared joys, and opportunities to pray for friends. I don't even mind when I see a diehard Gators fan tease an Alabama fan or a TCU fan tease a Husker fan. I am not, however, a huge fan of the political or religious posts.

This is not to say that I don't hold opinions and convictions – I absolutely do – and I believe that we all should. However, social media seems to have become an incubator where the division in our country today has grown to a higher level than ever before. Democrat or Republican? Pro-life or pro-choice? Christian or atheist? Baptist or Catholic? Green or purple? We are not short of lines that divide us.

I believe that a part of the problem is that, however non-confrontational we believe ourselves to be when we post, we cannot possibly control how our posts are read. For instance, if I were to text Susan, "CAN YOU PICK UP MILK ON THE WAY HOME?", she might rightly assume I'm yelling at her and not that I accidentally pressed the caps lock. Even if she gave me the benefit of the doubt, she might herself be going through something that would cause her to react badly. It's amazing how finding a snake in your house can change your mood ... but that's a story for another day. The point is that in digital communication, there is little if any opportunity to check for understanding, and because we have the power at our fingertips, we often succumb to the temptation to react immediately and in the rawness of our feelings.

Another culprit is our need to be right. Again, I am not contesting the fact that there is absolute truth as laid out in Scripture; however, my need to prove that I know it, is nothing more than pridefulness on my part. And we all know what the Bible says about pride and falling.

During the 90's WWJD became popular, and then trite, and then annoying, mostly because it became a sanctioned way to judge others – not unlike social media today; however, I believe that an examination of Jesus' actions when baited for an argument bears a good look.

In *Matthew 9:10-13* the Pharisees ridiculed Jesus for eating with and keeping the company of sinners. Instead of throwing a retort or accusation at them of the many sins He knew they had committed (and He absolutely knew He was in the right – He was God!), He asked them to consider a Scripture with which He knew they would be very familiar. *Hosea 6:6* "I want you to show love, not offer sacrifices. I want you to know me more than I want burnt offerings."

Jesus could have lashed out, used sarcasm, or even thrown out the very pious, "I'll be praying for you!" He could have taken them to task in an argument that He would surely have won. He could have treated them so badly for the sake of His being right. But Jesus, Lover of our souls, made the decision not to trade in shame. He chose love. He chose to give up His right to be right in order to teach them, to show them another way. He asked them to reconsider their actions in the light of a Scripture they knew about a man who, at great cost, chose to love a prostitute. And I wonder if He was hoping they would get the reference the Lord intended from the beginning of time to His own sacrificial love for us.

What does it look like to stand for Truth while loving like Jesus? If we knew that perfectly, we wouldn't need Jesus, but we do, and He is always ready and willing to be consulted when we have questions about any of our actions – even social media posts. Holy Spirit is always on call and wants every word we utter (or post) to glorify Him and lead people to love Him and each other.

After all of this, know that I am staying on social media, and that I plan to celebrate victories, mourn defeats, and make a concerted effort to connect with people in a meaningful way as much as possible. And as I do this, I plan to ask myself these things:

- How could someone who believes very differently take my words?
- Could my words be interpreted as sarcastic or mean-spirited?
- Could the post be construed as bragging or gloating?
- Am I dealing in shame to prove a point?
- Am I worried about being right or about loving people?

One thing is for certain – Susan and I really love all of you, and we are so grateful to be here at FCCB! Have a really great week!

FCCB Meeting Summary – Body of Trustees

Meeting Minutes / Monday, July 20, 2022

Present: Bob Meador, Scott Kelly, Mike Snyder, Carolyn Jones, David MacInnes & Mike Amos, Exec Pastor

Meeting called to order,10:00 am Opening Prayer: Mike Snyder

Bob Meador gave a Building & Grounds update:

- a. Solar window film has been completed.
- b. Repair of the shelves in the Choir Room is in process.
- c. Loft lights in the sanctuary is in process.
- d. Cry room conversion is in process.
- e. Mounting letters on Youth Bldg., trimming of palm trees, hook up of washer/dryer and garage door opener are all pending as "in-house" projects.
- f. Installation of Surveillance system in Youth Bldg. is pending.
- g. Replacement of condenser in Oceanfront classroom has been ordered.
- h. Replacement of condensing unit for office, AC system of the Nursery and John's office have been quoted.
- i. Install of Security System for the Youth Bldg. is pending.
- j. Building and Grounds budget will be in the red soon.

David MacInnes gave a banking update:

- a. Discussed the TAC Security/Monitoring system (for the Youth Bldg.) payment issues. It is currently being charged to the credit card, but at least one previous check has not cleared.
- b. The only vendor still on Auto Pay (VyStar checks) is Neptune Lawn. All previous Auto Pay vendors have been moved to recurring credit card payment.

Carolyn Popp update on Youth Bldg. blinds and the East Lawn platform:

- a. Blinds for the entire building will be \$6500+/-. The bathroom windows are visible from residences across the street. Bob will review the list and prioritize which blinds are needed the most to reduce the overall cost.
- b. The East Lawn platform will require a variance from the city as the property is zoned as four residential lots. This will require input from the residents in the neighborhood. Carolyn mentioned being careful what we call the project, and how to mitigate potential issues in obtaining the variance. There is the possibility of receiving up to \$42,000 in gifts and donations to offset the expected cost of \$50,000+/-.

Scott Kelly gave an update on Legal Review of Facility Use agreements and Sanctuary Projectors:

- a. He has not had any success in receiving return calls from attorneys of the legal review of a Facility Use Agreement. This is needed to make a decision on Young Life's use of our facilities. Mike Snyder will try to contact someone.
- b. The Sanctuary Projectors may need to be replaced with 4K projectors at a cost of \$1000+ ea. Scott will get prices. We will need to rent a scissor lift, as the ladder needed for the repairs is unstable for such use.

Mike Snyder brought the following items to the Trustees for discussion/action:

- a. Cost of Sunday's security increased to \$220 ea. Sunday.
- b. There's a difficulty in easily determining how much money is available to reduce the CFR loan principal balance. Mike will talk to John Jolly about including it in our monthly reports. Mike Amos is updating PushPay (church software) to better reflect donations made through the platform as gifts to pay down the Youth House debt.
- c. Thank-you letters need to go out to undesignated funds used to pay down the Youth House debt.
