

## The Ministry of Being a Little Bit Further Along

No church can survive solely upon the labors of its pastors. No church can thrive when the expectation is that all ministry must be formal and must originate from the front of the room. No church can remain healthy when it falls to the elders to give and the members to consume. Rather, the work of ministry within a local church is the privilege and responsibility of each of the people who makes that church their own.

One of the most important ministries that any Christian can engage in is also one of the most unheralded. One of the ministries that is key to the functioning of the local church and to advancement in the Christian life is also one of the most overlooked. It is the simplest of all ministries and the least formal, a ministry that each of us is equipped to carry out. It is the ministry of being just a little bit further along.

There is a place in the church and a place in life for expertise and formal training. But there is a much wider place for simple commitment and involvement. The great majority of the help people need as they navigate life's trials, the great bulk of the counsel people seek as they encounter life's questions, does not require the input of experts, but merely the attention of someone who knows his Word. They do not need someone who has access to the original languages or who exposit Scripture at a post-graduate level. They do not need someone who holds credentials from a Christian counseling organization or who has dedicated a whole lifetime to studying theology. These things are good and have their place, but they are not often truly necessary.

What most people need and long for as they face trials and encounter questions is simply the dedicated attention of someone who is a little bit further along, the listening ear and gentle voice of someone who is a few steps ahead on the path of life, or the path of ministry, or the path of suffering, or the path of parenting. Most are merely seeking someone who will informally mentor them from the perspective of their own successes and failures, their own experiences of good and bad, the godly wisdom they have accumulated along the way.

What's so wonderful about this ministry is that we can all take it up, for each of us is just a little bit further along than someone else. The father with toddlers is a little bit further along than the father with an infant, the mother who lost a child ten years ago to the one whose child has only just been laid in the grave. The Christian teen has taken a few more steps along the path of life than the child, the Christian senior than the one in her forties. Each of them can prayerfully look back and extend a helping hand, a word of advice, a prayer of intercession, to a person following along behind. Each of them can take up this ministry of blessing and encouragement, of Word and prayer, of time and attention. For they have the one key credential: they are a little bit further along.

What's Halloween all about? The name, Halloween, is simply a contraction of "All Hallows Evening". All Hallows Eve! Something Hallowed is something holy, dedicated to God. All Saints Day was a day set aside in the early church for remembering the dead, including saints (hallows), martyrs, and all faithful departed.

Halloween evolved partially from the ancient Celtic holiday of Samhain. The Day of the Dead (el Día de los Muertos), is a Mexican holiday where families welcome back the souls of their deceased relatives for a brief reunion that includes food, drink, and celebration. It's a blend of Mesoamerican ritual, European religion, and Spanish culture.

All these different observances combined in the United States into what we call Halloween today. Even the origins of our practice of "Trick or Treat" remain murky, but traces can be identified in ancient Celtic festivals, early Roman Catholic holidays, medieval practices—and even British politics.

But remember, it really is a time to remember our own departed loved ones now gone to heaven with God.

Once a month a team of volunteers from FCCB, Anchor Academy Elementary School, and BEAM work together with the BEAM Food Warehouse to provide free groceries to Anchor Academy families and other members (senior adults, those who work in the area) of the Beaches community.

We typically serve between 120 and 140 families representing 300-500 individuals. Along with a variety of fresh produce, frozen meats, dairy items, dry goods, and bakery items our volunteers offer words of kindness and encouragement as well as information about other assistance BEAM provides.

It’s a busy couple of hours unloading the truck, staging the items to be distributed, registering those attending, and loading the groceries into trunks, backseats, and truck beds, but so rewarding to be God’s hands, feet, and voice extended to those whom we serve.

Scott made a motion to approve the August Meeting Minutes, Ed seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

Mike gave an update on Youth Building loan, requested by the Leadership Council and Youth Building Committee.

The Trustees have reviewed all documentation and terms for a \$200,000 loan through Christian Financial Resources. A motion to accept the terms and move forward by Scott and seconded by Bob.

A Corporate Resolution Investments document was included and signed by Mike Snyder, Bob Meador, Scott Kelly and Kristin Jewell, which approved to enter into investment plans with CFR for the church.

# FCCB Meeting Summary – Body of Trustees

---

Present: Mike Snyder, Scott Kelly, John Jolly, Pastor Nathan Loewen, Bob Meador, Ed Washburn, Pastor John Madison

September 22, 2021, 10:00am - Meeting called to order by Chairman Mike

Opening Prayer: Pastor Nathan Loewen

Scott made a motion to approve the Special Meeting Minutes from September 7, 2021, Bob seconded the motion. All in favor, motion passed.

John Jolly presented current financials – all is in order and our finances are doing well, primarily due to expense cuts. Tithing is behind by approximately \$20K.

Ed reported on Buildings & Grounds:

- Carpets throughout the church have been cleaned and look good.
- Mercury Carpet is scheduled to replace carpet in the Admin offices on November 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Sanctuary lighting and several hard-to-reach lights throughout the rest of the church have been replaced.

Scott gave an insurance update:

- All the IT requirements have been completed and now seem to be running smoothly.
- Need to replace old power strips with UPS strips.
- Working on insurance issues for the church and he requested some information on the Youth House needs. Bob is assisting in that matter.

Bob gave an update on the Youth House:

- Coming along well, given the equipment and weather delays.
- Interior construction is beginning on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor, while weather delays have hampered progress on the outside.
- The installation of the lift in the building is the last major hurdle that could delay getting a Certificate of Occupancy. As of now, no issues in the progress of construction.

Mike gave an update on the CFR Loan:

- The loan is progressing nicely. We received the account information on the ready access account along with legal and signature documents, set up with CFR.
- We should be hearing back from our loan representative this week with more information and requirements. A closing date has not been set yet.

New Business:

Budget Input – The first review of the 2022 budget is due back to the Leadership Council by October 15<sup>th</sup>. Mike asked that all Trustees send in special requirements or required project costs for 2022 to him by September 30<sup>th</sup> to be included in the input. The budget input will be sent back to the Trustees for review, prior to submission.

Church Van – A motion was made by Ed, seconded by Scott and approved by all, that the van be wrapped. The Trustees reviewed the graphics and approved it. Maintenance and use of the van were also discussed. The lack of use was determined to be the biggest problem. It was recommended and approved that Pastor John take these issues on and start using the van, get maintenance completed and follow up on any repairs required. The van will still be available to church groups as always, through the church office.

Youth House Furniture – Pastor Nathan motioned, seconded by Scott and approved by all, to purchase furniture using the church debit card. Pastor John and Pastor Nathan reported that purchasing furniture online was about half the cost purchasing locally. A one time use of the debit card was approved with strict guidelines set up by the Trustees.
