Search Committee: Associate Pastor of Administration/Executive Pastor

Meet Mike Amos

I am pleased to introduce Mike Amos, candidate for our Associate Pastor of Administration/Executive Pastor position. Our committee began meeting in April 2021 and reviewed approximately 90 resumes. As required by our By-laws, the Search Committee prioritized the candidates, conducting at least a second interview with a minimum of two candidates, including a visit to our church campus and congregation, interviews with the Search Committee and various constituent groups. (We interviewed three.) Preaching is not a primary focus of this position, so none of the candidates preached at a worship service. Mike has been a leading candidate since we received his resume.

On November 2, 2021, the Search Committee voted unanimously to recommend to the Body of Elders that we call Mike to the position. On November 28, 2021, the Body of Elders voted unanimously by secret ballot to call Mike and recommends to the FCCB Congregation that we call Mike. The Congregation will vote on calling Mike by secret ballot at the Congregational meeting on December 12, 2021. The intent of this summary is to introduce you to him before the meeting.

Mike has a BS/BA in Business Administration from Midland Lutheran College and a Graduate Degree from Southern Methodist University' Graduate School of Banking. He has twenty-six years of banking experience. Throughout his banking years he and his wife Susan (They have been married 28 years and have two adult sons) were active members of their local community of faith serving in a variety of capacities (Youth Leaders, Sunday School Teachers, Church Council, Deacon Board, and Elder). In January 2017 the church where they had worshipped and served for the past five years asked Mike to become their Executive Pastor. After prayerful consideration Mike and Susan realized that God was calling them to full-time ministry. He resigned as President of the Borger, Texas, Branch of Happy State Bank and became the Executive Pastor of The River Church in Panhandle, Texas. Initially his role was almost exclusively administrative, but over time he moved into a more pastoral role and was ordained in 2018. Mike resigned his position in December 2020 because he and Susan knew the Lord was calling them to do so, trusting that He would lead them to a new place of service. Mike saw our posting and submitted his resume in April 2021.

The Committee has verified Mike's credentials, talked at length with Mike and each of his references, interviewed him via Zoom. He and Pastor Nathan have had numerous phone and email conversations. Various members of the Search Committee have as well. Mike and Susan came to Neptune Beach October 23-27 so that they could visit all of our worship services, meet personally and formally with the Search Committee, Pastor Nathan, Pastor John and other members of the church staff and leadership as well as many of our congregation as visitors.

THE ADVENT SEASON IS UPON US

Luke 4:4 And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, **5** to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. **6** And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. **7** And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Here we are at the start of the advent season when we as a church begin more concentrated attention to the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. As we light the next advent candle each week and read from the scripture, we grow closer to the celebration of Jesus coming to the earth in human form. That God would have His own Son being born in a small town and in a stable constructed for animals, it's understandable that people of that day had a difficult time believing that He was to be the Messiah as predicted about 700 years before.

While we as Christians understand the "Reason for the Season", non-believers in the secular world are concentrating on presents, parties, holiday music and the busy times that go with the Christmas time of the year. It is up to us to gently remind everyone that the birth of Jesus the Christ should be the focus of this time of year.

Luke 4:8 And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. **9** And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with fear. **10** And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. **11** For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. **12** And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." **16** And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger.

God didn't have the elite of the Jewish society be notified of the birth of Jesus. He told the lowly shepherds in the field, and they hurried to see this miracle. What a plan!

Remember, we all need to invite our friends, family, and neighbors to attend our Christmas Eve service in hopes that they may be touched by the Holy Spirit and come to a full understanding that what we are really celebrating is the birth of our Savior.

Mission Moment

FCCB is a faith partner of Mission House, the only day facility to help meet the needs of homeless adults at the Beaches through compassion, faith, and programs designed to provide assistance at an individual level. FCCB provides monthly financial support through our Missions budget and through various in-kind support through volunteer opportunities and donations of needed items.

FCCB in coordination with Mission House and other local beaches churches provides overnight shelter and food for the beaches homeless on nights when available weather forecasts for our area predict a temperature of 40F (including wind chill) or 45F with high chance of rain. Due to COVID restrictions last winter Cold Night Shelter operated differently than in past years, but this winter we will again host Cold Night on our campus on a rotating basis with other participating churches.

The call for need comes to the church office from Mission House. Leslie Hale, our Office Manager, consults the church calendar to determine if our space is available. If so, she consults with our Cold Night Coordinator to call the volunteer team into action. Mission House also alerts Neptune Beach police when we are hosting Cold Night Shelter. They check on us throughout the event and are always available to help if needed. We need more volunteers than "just enough" as everyone is not available every time the need arises.

We're preparing now so that we can be ready when the need arises. Volunteer opportunities include:

- ♥ Soup makers: recipes provided, make ahead of time and place in designated freezer at FCCB
- ♥ Communication leader: Alert volunteer team via phone or email of FCCB's turn to serve
List who is doing what and when
- ♥ Van driver and assistant: Evening and morning route to pick up and deliver attendees
- ♥ Greeters/registrars: Evening shift-Welcome and supervise sign-in of attendees
Pass out blankets
Morning shift-Collect blankets
Distribute bag lunches as attendees leave
- ♥ Shoppers/gleaners: Obtain needed food items for night meal, bag lunches, and breakfast
- ♥ Kitchen helpers: Evening shift-Warm and serve soups on hand, clean up kitchen afterward
Night shift-Prepare bag lunches for morning distribution
Morning shift-Prepare and serve light breakfast, clean up kitchen afterward
- ♥ Nighttime hosts (4-hour shifts):
Supervise during the night-lights out call and enforcement
Supervise during the early morning-wakeup call, attendees out by 7AM
- ♥ Cleaning crew: Vacuum Fellowship Hall, clean bathrooms

Prayerfully consider if God is calling you to serve as a Cold Night volunteer. Contact Barbara Lynn, Mission Team leader (barbaraclynn@gmail.org or 904-307-0344) for more information or to sign up to help. You will be a blessing as well as be blessed.

Minutes Approval: A motion to approve presented by Kristin and seconded by Ed. All in favor, motion passed.

Financials: John Jolly provided (in abstention) the monthly financials, and everyone present, having had time to review them prior to the meeting, agreed that all was in order.

Buildings & Grounds:

- Ed reported that the new carpet tiles have been installed in the administrative area of the church and look great!
- Ed updated us on the cleaning crew challenges. A new crew has been assigned to FCCB and so far, the new crew is doing a much better job.

Credit Cards: Kristin provided an update on the ongoing issues we have had with VyStar. Now all is as it should be.

Chairman Update: Mike provided the following updates.
