An open letter to the Congregation of First Christian Church of the Beaches

Greetings Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am writing this to inform you that the Elders of FCCB have been in a time of discernment regarding our future with the Disciples of Christ denomination. After months of research and prayer, the Body of Elders unanimously recommended to the Congregation to withdraw our membership in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) denomination. Many of you will have questions regarding this recommendation and I hope to answer some of them in this letter.

For some years there have been troubling trends in the theology of ministers ordained by the denomination. We discovered when searching for the replacement for Pastor Mahlon Dixon that there were ministers who did not believe in the resurrection of Christ, who considered the Bible to be simply the thoughts of men rather than the revelation of God to man and even one who considered that "Jesus was a lovely myth". How pervasive this has become was reinforced when the search went out for a Youth Pastor and an Executive Pastor. The research done by the Elders has not only confirmed this, but revealed just how extensive it is along with other theological inaccuracies.

One of your biggest questions may be 'will we be negatively impacted if we leave? The answer to that is no. The denomination has no financial liens on our property. We are not required to "buy out" of the denomination. The only financial move we have to make will be to relocate our Endowment fund to another institution. We can still be a "Reformation Movement" Church. We can still claim the work done by the organizers of the Reformation movement, Campbell, and Stone. We still retain our identity. You will see no changes to how we worship, our theology, or in how we work. Why you are here will not change. We will still be known as First Christian Church of the Beaches.

Please know that this has not been an easy decision. Many of the Elders, including myself, are life-long Disciples. It is heartbreaking that our denomination has strayed so far from the New Testament Church that Campbell and Stone envisioned.

The Elders cannot make the decision to leave the denomination. Only a congregational vote can make that happen. All we can do is recommend. We are asking that you prayerfully consider this matter. Please feel free to talk to the Elders and our Pastors. We are happy to share our research with you if needed. The first Town Hall meeting on this matter will be held on June 4 at 6:00 p.m. Another Town Hall meeting will be on June 7 at 6:00 p.m. Please feel free to attend both if you like. A special Congregational meeting will be called on June 11 at 5:00 p.m. for a vote. We hope you will come and cast your vote.

Grace and peace to you, my dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I pray that this letter finds you well and filled with the joy and love of our Lord Jesus Christ. It is with a heavy heart yet an unwavering conviction that I pen these words to you today. After much contemplation, prayer, and seeking guidance from our Heavenly Father, I have come to a decision that I feel compelled to share with you. I have decided to no longer remain a minister within The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) denomination, but I will remain the Lead Pastor at First Christian Church of the Beaches.

For the past eight years, I have dedicated myself to the noble cause of leading a change in direction and theology within our denomination, The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Regrettably, my efforts have met with no success, and I find myself unwelcome to serve on any committee within our denomination. It has been a challenging journey, one filled with both hope and disappointment.

Throughout these years, I have witnessed a growing trend within our denomination, where pastors are not only allowed but even encouraged to preach and believe in doctrines that stand in direct contradiction to the teachings of the Holy Scriptures. The divinity of Christ, the nature of His resurrection, and the exclusivity of Jesus as the only way for salvation have become matters of compromise and controversy. These are fundamental aspects of our faith that should never be compromised or watered down.

During my sabbatical last summer, in moments of deep reflection and seeking God's will, I was met with a profound realization. Our struggle and fight for truth within the denomination had reached its conclusion. It became evident to me that I could no longer associate myself as a colleague with pastors who do not proclaim the unadulterated gospel and fail to hold fast to the essentials of our faith.

Therefore, it is with a heavy yet resolved heart that I have decided to no longer remain a minister within The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) denomination. This decision was not made lightly, and it brings with it a mix of emotions, ranging from sadness to a renewed sense of purpose. I want you to know that my love for you remains unwavering, and it is because of this love that I feel compelled to take this course of action.

My departure from the denomination does not signify an end to my ministry or my commitment to shepherding you through the journey of faith. On the contrary, it marks a new chapter in our collective walk with Christ. I am confident that together we can strengthen our faith, deepen our understanding of the Scriptures, and be a beacon of truth in a world that is increasingly clouded by confusion and compromise.

I implore you, my beloved, to join me in prayer as we embark on this new season. Let us pray for guidance, unity, and discernment as we navigate the path that lies ahead. I am committed to walking alongside you, remaining steadfast in our pursuit of Christ, and nurturing a community rooted in the unchanging truth of God's Word.

May the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. I look forward to continuing our journey together as we seek to honor and glorify our Lord in all that we do.

Where do you go to church? It is a question that people ask all the time. There is a difference between going to church and being a member. I know a lot of folks that haven't officially joined the church, but they attend services regularly, are active in Bible studies or volunteer roles, and some give faithfully. By appearances, it looks like you are a member, but for some reason they haven't officially joined. What is the big deal with being a member? In Hebrews 10:25, Paul instructs us to "Let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near." Now, I know that Paul doesn't talk about becoming a member of a church. Let me remind you that you get to choose your church family.

My guess is that most of us wouldn't stay at a church that didn't preach the Bible and most of us would only go to a church where we liked the people that go to said church. Maybe for some people they are not exactly sure what the church believes. The sermons that you hear every Sunday should give you a level of understanding. If you still aren't sure, I suggest you ask the pastors or elders about the beliefs of the church.

Unfortunately, no church is perfect because they are all run by imperfect people. Paul tells us in Romans 3:23, "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." We should not put our trust in man, or we will be let down again and again. We don't trust people because they are trustworthy, but we trust them because He is always trustworthy.

No church is perfect, but the Bible tells us that we are all important to the body of Christ. We all have a function in the body and without you, something is missing. We may need you to help with kid's church, lead a Bible study or serve on Sunday. One of our requirements to serve is to be a member. Joining FCCB is very easy. You come talk to Pastor Nathan during the invitation song at the end of service. He will ask you if you follow Christ and then he will present you as a member of our church.

If you aren't sure if you are a member, ask a pastor before or after service and we will find out for you. Don't let the enemy, fear or ignorance keep you from joining your church family. If this is your church home, stand with your church family and join today!

FCCB is a community partner of the Sulzbacher Beaches Health Center. A portion of your Mission dollars (10% of each month's tithes and offerings) supports the work of this vital ministry. The clinic also benefits from the services of local nurses, doctors, residents and interns from the University of Florida, Florida State University, Jacksonville University, and the University of North Florida. Volunteer opportunities are available. Go to <http://sulzbacherjax.org/support-us/volunteer> for more information.

The Sulzbacher Beaches Clinic offers a complete range of services to those in need in our community: the homeless, uninsured, underinsured, and those whose income falls below 200% of current Federal Poverty. Services are offered on a sliding fee discount and no individual is turned away for their ineligibility to pay.

The Sulzbacher Beaches Clinic comprehensive care includes:

- **Primary Health Care:** operates under the direction of a full-time Medical Director and managing staff nurse. They are assisted by a clinical care coordinator, medical case manager, nurse practitioners and a host of volunteer healthcare professionals from the community. The clinic provides a comprehensive medical assessment and treatment for any health issues that are discovered. Patients who qualify receive top-quality health care in the clinic for little or no cost.
- **Behavioral Health Care:** Behavioral health clinicians provide assessments, psychiatric and counseling services to uninsured patients who are homeless or living in unstable housing.
- **Dental Care:** The clinic provides an array of comprehensive oral health care services for adults and children, including fillings, bridges, and crowns.
- **Prescription Assistance Program (PAP):** The staff helps patients who meet the PAP guidelines access medications free of charge. NOTE: The clinic does not prescribe controlled substances.
- **Health-education classes**
- **Vision screenings and low-cost glasses**

Saving and Investing

Joseph wisely counseled Pharaoh to store up grain while it was available so that Egypt could draw on these resources in more difficult times (Gen. 41:33-36).

The Proverbs use the ant to illustrate the wisdom of gathering and storing provisions for future needs (Prov. 6:6-11; 30:24-25; cf. 13:11,22; 21:20; 22:3).

Saving requires the discipline of limiting present expenditures to provide for future needs. ***Denial is not popular in a culture that tells us to indulge our appetites, but Scripture counsels us to pursue a path of moderation and self-control (Prov. 21:17; 23:20-21; 24:27).***

Savings are beneficial because they provide a reserve that can be used to pay for unexpected expenses and assist others in special needs. They also enable us to make major purchases without going into debt and paying interest. In addition, savings provide a resource for making investments. However, we should be aware of the built-in danger in savings and investments: they tempt us to put our trust and affection in them rather than God.

Believers should never "fix their hope on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly supplies us with all things to enjoy" (1 Tim. 6:17; 6:10).

"He who trusts in his riches will fall" (Prov. 11:28a).

New Women's Christian Book Study

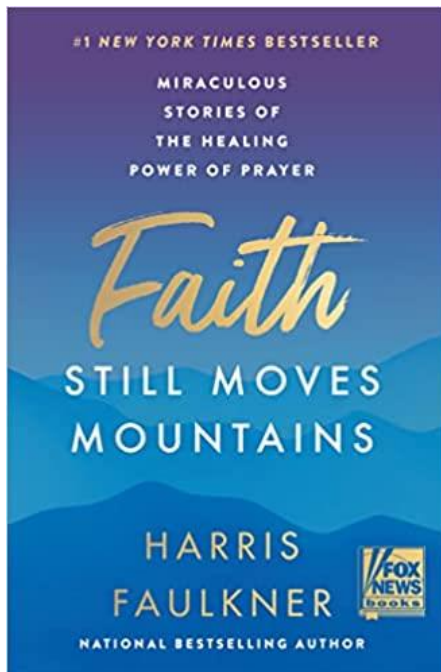

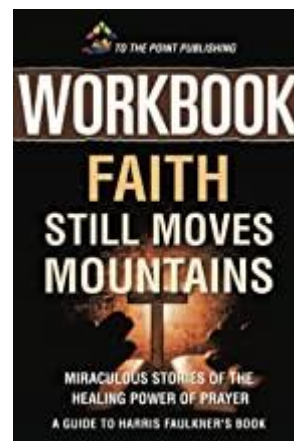

Meeting Minutes
Wednesday, May 17, 2023

Present: Bob Meador, Scott Kelly, Carolyn Jones-Popp, David MacInnes and Mark Lopiano
Also Present: Mike Amos, Executive Pastor

Meeting called to order: 10:00am by Carolyn Jones-Popp, Chair

Opening Prayer: Mark Lopiano

Review of prior meeting minutes: Kelly moved approval of the February 15, 2023 meeting minutes. Second by Meador followed by a short discussion. Motion passed without objection.

Financial Report:

- Mike Amos provided financial documents showing we had a deficit of \$1800+/- for April and the deficit YTD is \$35,000+/- . Discussion was held about cutting expenses and making the congregation aware of the shortage in giving, and the large maintenance expenses currently in process and others expected soon.
- Mike Amos is looking into a Federal Refund Program established for businesses (including churches) who retained employees during the pandemic. Other churches and businesses have been able to receive refunds.
- The Nucleus online giving platform switch from PushPay has begun. About 40% of recurring online givers have already switched to Nucleus. Mike will begin making calls to the rest in the next week to assist them as needed to make the change.

Building & Grounds:

- Bob Meador says repairs on the sprinkler pump for the main campus is in process.
- Bob reported the condensing unit for the north sanctuary has been ordered.
- Scott Kelly has ordered light bulbs for the projector.

VyStar Update:

- VyStar and 121 Financial Credit Union are merging before year end. It is not expected to have a major impact on FCCB.

Carolyn Jones-Popp Update:

- The East Yard/Outdoor Platform was approved by Neptune Beach. It next goes to the State of Florida for review/approval.
- The CFR loan has been paid in full.

New Business:

- Estimates were provided for the exterior electrical box on the east side of the Fellowship Hall. One was from Limbaugh Electrical and the other from United Electric. The consensus was that we would not consider the kitchen portion of the estimates at this time, and we would only consider the Stainless Steel panel and box. Comparing “apples to apples” the Limbaugh estimate is approximately \$46,000, and the United estimate is approximately \$60,000. **Bob Meador moved we recommend the Limbaugh estimate to the Leadership Council. Scott Kelly seconded, and the motion was approved unanimously.**

Chair adjourned the meeting at 11:00am, with prayer by Scott Kelly
