As the sun was rising over the horizon, the world around me stood motionless. Then in the distance you could begin to hear the faint sound of a boat engine purring as it broke through the stillness of Jenny Lake. And as the trip went along, I was becoming better, swifter, and despite what my watch indicated to me, more acclimated. However, other than doing some light reading and planning, I had not prepared my body for the journey I was on.

Often, we find ourselves thrust into a circumstance in which we have no preparation before tending to the matter at hand. Or maybe we have just done a little light reading or planning but nothing serious.

We can find this to be true on our faith journey. We have done light reading, maybe some planning, but we have not fully tended seriously to the matter of preparedness. Peter writes in his first letter that we are to always be prepared to give an answer for the reason of our hope and to do it with gentleness. Yet when we are thrust into a hike amid our faith journey, we find ourselves wildly unprepared. We climb and our lungs burn, and our breathing is labored and shortened. Our legs become heavy and harder to pick up. Our balance that we thought we had suddenly is not so great. In our own minds we begin questioning and wondering about our faith and our hope. Have we prepared ourselves to answer the questions we have when life gets harder? Are we prepared to hike alongside someone who has a mountain to overcome and encourage them not with platitudes but with the very hope we have in Christ?

We are called to more than a Sunday morning gathering. We are called to hike and journey together and to prepare one another for the hike ahead.

Mike's Musings

If you have been around church at all, you have probably heard Matthew 5:5 that Jesus said, "the meek shall inherit the Earth". Humble or Humility is mentioned 81 times in the Bible. Humble means having or showing a modest or low estimate of one's own importance. It is human nature to want to be recognized or to stand out in a crowd. Society tells us that if we aren't first, then we are last. Even the disciples wanted to know who would be the greatest among them.

Jesus went on to say in Matthew 23:11-12 that, "The greatest among you will be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted." Have you ever humbled yourself? Have you ever been humiliated by someone else? Which do you prefer? I know that it is a lot easier to humble yourself than to be humiliated.

Being humble is a form of love. Wives are supposed to submit to their husbands. Husbands are supposed to love their wife like Christ loved the church. He died for his church! Children are supposed to honor their mother and father. These are all examples of humbling oneself from the Bible.

Compare the widow, who gave all she had to the rich young ruler. Pastor John talked about the rich young ruler last month in his sermon. He said that if Jesus had only said sell half of everything you own instead of all that you own, he might have been able to do it. The widow trusted that God would provide but the rich young ruler couldn't get there.

I think a big problem for me is that I always thought that I was humble. However, God has humbled me many times. One way that he humbled me was by showing me how prideful I was. I had a couple people in my life that frustrated me to no end. I used to pray for them (which is a good thing), but it was how I prayed that was prideful. I used to ask God to change them so it wouldn't frustrate me. God brought me low when he showed me how prideful that was. We are supposed to pray for our neighbor for healing, for salvation, and for love. However, praying for someone to change to make your life easier is very prideful. Now God has shown me other areas of my life that I had pride, and I am sure there are other areas that I still need to deal with my lack of humility. Jesus is always the best example for us. He never once boasted or bragged about any of his work, and he always gave God the credit.

Another humbling thought to me is that there is nothing that I can do to save myself. Jesus is the only way to heaven for everyone. There is nothing that I can do to upgrade my standing with Jesus. Paul writes in his letter to the Colossians (3:23-24) Whatever you do, do it from the heart, as something done for the Lord and not for people, knowing that you will receive the reward of an inheritance from the Lord. You serve the Lord Christ.

What are some ways to walk in humility? Ask God to show you those areas where you lack humility. Where are places where you try to be first? How can you put yourself last? Next, look about for opportunities to serve. Serving others is a great way to humble yourself. Who do you have trouble serving?

In Romans 8:35-39, Paul wrote that no matter what the circumstances of life are, God is always with us and always loves us. Verses 38 and 39, in particular, are favorites of mine. "Neither life nor death, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation can separate us from the love of God."

This is a wonderful and comforting promise. It tells me that no matter what I do today or whatever I do tomorrow and the rest of the days of my life, God will still love me.

I can see that it would be easy for God to love me while I am writing this personal testimony of His love and grace. But will He still love me when I run out to do errands later today if I get impatient in traffic and let another driver know how ticked off he makes me? Will He still love me if I'm careless in the way I interact with my family and friends? Will He still love me when my mind dwells on uncharitable or unworthy thoughts? Will He still love me when I am lazy or disobedient and ignore His will for my life?

The amazing answer is, YES, He will!

This Scripture says that there is *nothing* and *no one* in this physical world, or the spiritual world that can keep His love away from me.

God's great love for us is almost too much for us to comprehend. As mere mortals, it is impossible for us to fully grasp the depth and totality of God's unconditional love. Probably the closest approximation we can make is in the love parents have for their children.

I will never forget the first time my daughter was brought to me in the hospital on the day of her birth. I practically snatched her away from the nurse, I was so eager to hold her in my arms. I pulled aside the blanket and counted her fingers and toes, examining her tiny body with wonder and awe. Her silky hair was already hanging down the back of her neck and those big blue eyes just stared right back at me. I was so overwhelmed with love that I lost my breath! I knew instant, total commitment! I can remember thinking that there was nothing that I wouldn't do for this child. And, as much as my love for Dendy has continued to strengthen and grow to this day, *God's* love for her, and for me, and for you, is even greater. What an incredible gift!

My late Uncle Bill put it this way: "Betty, God couldn't stop loving you if He tried. That's His job." And that is the case with each of us today. It is impossible for God to stop loving us! Halleluiah!

Stewardship of Talent

We have seen that stewardship in the Scriptures always relates to the management of something that does not belong to us, but to someone else. Even our talents and special abilities belong to God. We own nothing that was not first given to us: *"And what do you have that you did not receive? But if you did receive it, why do you boast as if you had not received it?" (1 Corinthians 4:7).*

God has entrusted us with aptitudes and abilities, and as good stewards, we must use them for His glory and not our own. This is true not only of musical, artistic, athletic, academic, business, and persuasive talents, but also of the spiritual gifts we have received (see the Search booklet on spiritual gifts).

"And since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let each exercise them accordingly" (Romans 12:6).

Peter specifically relates spiritual gifts to the concept of stewardship: *"As each one has received a special gift, employ it in serving one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God" (1 Peter 4:10).*

Faithful stewardship of natural talents and spiritual gifts requires that we use them to glorify God and edify others. Our purpose is not to please ourselves, but to serve others.

"Let each of us please his neighbor for his good, to his edification. For even Christ did not please Himself" (Romans 15:2-3a).

Paul adds: *"Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves." Philipians 2:3-4.*

FCCB Meeting Summary – Body of Trustees

Meeting Minutes / Wednesday, August 17, 2022

Present: Bob Meador, Mike Snyder, Carolyn Jones, David MacInnes, Nathan Loewen, Mike Amos, John Jolly

Meeting called to order, 10:00 am

Opening Prayer: Nathan Loewen

Prior meeting minutes: Meador moved to approve; Snyder seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Financial Report:

- Jolly explained our income exceeded expenses for July by \$953 and Year to Date by \$3400.
- Jolly will sit down with Amos to gain a better understanding of financials as we bring bookkeeping services back in-house.
- Amos has a self-generated deadline of October 1st to bring financial accounting in-house and give us time to be fully in charge of bookkeeping by year end.

Building & Grounds Bob Meador gave an update:

- Loft lights have been purchased.
- A/C Condenser (\$5646) and the A/C unit for nursery and John's office (\$15,937) are not in yet. Invoices pending receipt of material.
- Youth Bldg. Security System (1750) is not in yet.
- Building and Grounds will be in the hole at least \$8000 this year.
- 2 Projectors (about \$1900 each) and will be covered from Worship and Technology line items.
- Steve will buy and install blinds in the Youth Bldg. bathrooms.

Outdoor Worship Space:

FCCB is organizing a project to replace the 8 am Sunday service outdoor platform with a permanent structure. A committee was formed to carry the project forward. Carolyn Jones-Chair, Mike Snyder, Gary Grider & William Popp. Jim Vernon will serve as an advisor. Pastor Nathan and Pastor Mike are invited to attend all meetings to give advice. The committee will report to the Body of Trustees.

Items discussed were:

1. Start with deciding what we want and sketch it out, listing the size of the concrete base
2. Marking the layout of the proposed platform on the grass.
3. Platform Committee (PC) talking to civil engineers to find one able to take on the project immediately.
4. Getting estimates for the structural design, and then proceeding with the design.
5. Hire a surveyor to survey either the single parcel for the Outdoor Platform or all 4 parcels in the field.
6. Decide if our committee will oversee the project by hiring subs and coordinating the construction.
7. Request initial funding to hire the necessary assistance.
8. Begin construction.

Potential issues include the Neptune Beach Building Dept. and City Council, as well as the neighbors.

Jones suggested naming the project the Open-Air Gazebo for community buy-in. This was accepted without objection. She is checking with surveyors as a first step. With no objection, Trustees suggested a proposed slab size of 15'X30'.

Discussion of funding the initial costs of surveys and plans was discussed. In an effort to better utilize available funding, this project will incorporate Outdoor Play Yard and New Church Start marked donation funds.

Building Use Agreement:

Due to a request from Young Life to use the Youth Building, the Building Use Agreement (FU-D) was amended. After discussion Snyder moved, Jones seconded the new FU-D be adopted, and Young Life's proposed agreement be rejected. Discussion clarified the new agreement satisfies our concerns, "should" satisfy their concerns. The Indemnity Form (FU-E) is to be used for vendors using our property on a one-time basis and purpose. Vote was unanimous in favor of the motion.

Church Treasurer:

John Jolly would like to retire as the Church Treasurer. Following discussion, Snyder moved, and Jones seconded, naming Mike Amos the Church Treasurer as of October 1st. Motion carried unanimously.

Budget:

Snyder suggested everyone start putting together numbers for next year's budget.

VyStar:

MacInnes learned we do not have overdraft protection on our checking account with VyStar. It is a free service, and funds would be transferred from the Money Market Account in the unlikely occurrence funds were delayed in being transferred to cover any issued checks. Since there is no policy against this protection, the consensus was to go ahead and set it up.

Long Range Plan:

It was reviewed and discussed by the Trustees. Snyder moved, Meador seconded, the Trustees have read and support the Plan.

Evaluations:

Amos will work up changes to the Policy and Procedure Manual's Appendix 8 regarding who performs employee evaluations. It is hoped we can have a brief meeting to approve the changes before the next Trustee meeting.

Mike Amos closed the meeting with prayer at 11:35 am.
