In Mark 10:17-27, Mark tells us about Jesus' encounter with a wealthy young man. The man asked what he needs to do to have eternal life. Jesus lists the commandments and the young man replies, "Teacher, I have kept all of these from my youth." Jesus tells him that he lacks one thing and that he should go sell all of his possessions and give the proceeds to the poor. Verse 22 says, "But he was dismayed by the demand, and went away grieving, because he had many possessions". Jesus went on to explain the whole encounter to the disciples and its meaning.

The rich young ruler idolized his possessions more than God. Mark Urquhart, a former pastor of mine says, "It is ok to have possessions, but it is not okay to let your possessions have you."

The point is that everything we have (life, money, health, and stuff) comes from God's provision. He is responsible for all we have. God asks for 10% of our first fruits and our thanks for the provision that he gives us daily.

The Israelites were blessed by God in the Old Testament and the book of Exodus shows how they were. They were free in the wilderness for the first time in years. These people survived the plagues that God put on Egypt, the parting of the Red Sea, and followed a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire at night. Two chapters after the Red Sea, the Israelites complained about not having anything to drink. God provided. They complained shortly after about being hungry to the point that they were saying "if only we had died by the Lord's hand in Egypt." God provided. It happened over and over to these people who saw the Lord work in their favor time after time.

Hopefully, you identify with the Israelites because we overlook the blessings that God provides every day. You woke up this morning. Provision. The sun is shining today. Provision. You have food in your pantry. Provision. There are too many blessings to count. I would encourage you to thank God daily for his provision over you.

Elder's Corner

What does it mean to be baptized? What does it mean when we declare we want to be baptized?

I was baptized in the First Christian Church in Elsberry, Missouri. I was 12 years old. I had just returned from my first church summer camp experience. At camp I said I accept Jesus Christ as my Savior. I said it again before my immersion into baptism. I joined the church with several of my friends from camp. It was the thing to do, but I really didn't know what I was getting into.

What is Christian baptism? According to an internet source it is a voluntary ceremony whereby a person publicly declares he or she has come to a saving faith in Jesus Christ. Christian baptism is performed by dipping the believer under water and lifting him or her up again, symbolically representing the believer's acceptance of Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection for their sins. Among the Biblical references of baptism that can be found are 1 Peter 3:21, John 3:5, Mark 16:16, Matthew 28:19, Romans 6:4, Corinthians 12:13, Galatians 3:27, Romans 6:3-4.

As I matured in years I also have matured in my Christian walk. I have studied the Bible and I have taught the Bible stories. I have been a part of Christian study groups within the church. I have led the choir in singing the Bible messages. I have grown in my faith.

In 2017 I was baptized again as an adult. A highlight in my life was the opportunity to go to the Holy Land and follow the footsteps of Jesus. I entered the River Jordan where Jesus was baptized, and I was baptized by Pastor Chris Hopkins and Elder Don Peters. As I came up from those waters I felt, I really felt, the Holy Spirit. I know now what it is to be baptized. I know now what it is to declare that Jesus Christ is my Savior. I know now that I need to serve and be a witness of His saving grace.

Our church is blessed to have had good youth leaders through the years. I now see Pastor John witnessing and interacting with the youth in our church. I see him showing them how to walk with Jesus. I have heard the negative comments about today's youth, but I believe God's grace is sufficient to overcome the evil that our youth face. I believe, as they each make the decision to be baptized, they will know what they are getting into. Baptism isn't another camp experience; baptism is a life changing experience.

FCCB Meeting Summary – Body of Trustees

Meeting Minutes Wednesday, April 20, 2022

Present: Bob Meador, Scott Kelly, Mike Snyder, Carolyn Jones, David MacInnes Also Present: Nathan Loewen, Lead Pastor; Mike Amos, Exec Pastor; John Jolly, Church Treasurer

Meeting called to order at 10:00 am

Opening Prayer: Bob Meador

Review of prior meeting minutes: Kelly motioned to approve the minutes as presented, Meador seconded. The motion unanimously passed.

Financial Report: John Jolly gave a general budget review. Discussion was held on John Madison's \$25,000 Housing allowance. Bob moved, Kelly seconded allowing that Madison's payroll allocations be adjusted to allow \$25,000 (annually) to be considered a Housing Allowance. Motion carried unanimously.

Mike Snyder brought the following items to the Trustees for discussion/action:

- a. Boy Scout checking account with Ameris Bank needs new signature card authorization. He suggested Carolyn Jones & David MacInnes should be new signers as their tenure is the longest among current Trustees. They will replace the existing signers on the account. Meador moved Jones & MacInnes be the new signers, Kelly seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.
- b. The building of a new Platform/Stage at the north end of the east yard, and scale it down from the original discussion. Any decision will be made after review of design, engineering (if needed), and cost. Motion made by Meador to begin discussion on a deck with a pergola and moving forward with the stated donor. Jones seconded and the motion passed unanimously.
- c. Bringing bookkeeping/accounting/check-writing services back "in-house". A long discussion was held considering such a move. Exec Pastor Amos thinks it is a smart way to go. Snyder moved and Kelly seconded, Jolly & Amos will determine when to bring the accounting/check-writing services back in house, and to also review the payroll (ADP) services as well. Each one will be brought back separately to the Trustees for review and discussion before making the change.
- d. There is concern over the donation of material gifts to the church and the receipt/use of those gifts. In addition, there are many existing plaques/signs that may need to be moved to a new/central location or removed. The Trustees had a lengthy discussion about the perception of removal or moving of existing plaques/signs, but a policy is needed going forward. Snyder moved, Meador seconded that a Moratorium is now in place on non-financial gifts until the gift policy is reviewed/modified, and a plaque/sign policy is established. The motion carried unanimously.

Bob Meador gave a Building & Grounds update:

- a. Discussion of check writing procedures for recurring payments. Mission payments are currently receiving checks written by our bookkeeping service. Discussion to set these up on monthly Auto Pay through VyStar. We currently have five services set up on Auto Pay, and discussion was to pay these through a VyStar Credit Card to achieve reward points. Motion was made and seconded to move mission payments to VyStar Auto Pay, and any of the merchants who will accept credit card payments, to be moved from VyStar Auto Pay to one of the FCCB credit cards. Motion passed unanimously.
- b. Oven repair. Cline is the factory authorized service technician for our gas oven. They have been out and believe the oven is in good working order. Those using the oven say it is not

working properly. They are coming out one more time to meet with Amos, Snyder, and Leslie Williams to inspect the oven. This will be the final trip, and then we will deal with the results of this last inspection.

c. Youth House is complete. There is approximation \$40,000 remaining from the loan. Meador moved, Snyder seconded applying the \$40,000 to the Principal Balance with CFR. Motion passed unanimously.

David MacInnes gave a VyStar update:

- a. FCCB has accumulated approximately 232,000 UChoose points. This is the approximate equivalent of \$2250 in some Gift Cards. This is informational in nature at present. MacInnes will look into other options with the points (credit to acct)
- b. The Choir room is very hot during Wednesday rehearsals. The recent repair of the Evaporator Core is very helpful, but the sun on the west windows still make the unit run very hard to keep up with 30+ people in the room. It was suggested perhaps some decorative or sun blocking film on those windows would be helpful. Meador will investigate the cost.

A Letter was written to the Youth House contractor regarding the floor issue (especially the 3rd floor). It will be signed by Snyder on behalf of the Body of Trustees.

But beyond this, she deserves to be treated with kindness and respect at this very difficult time. They offer a wide range of support services and educational resources at no cost to clients in a professional, timely, and confidential manner. They have five centers in Jacksonville (West Beaches/Kernan, Mandarin, Clay County/Telehealth, Baker County, Northside) and a Mobile Center.

Many of our women are Prayer Partners of FCWS, receiving text messages concerning prayer needs of their clients. (Client confidentiality is kept by using two initials that are not the client's own.)

Greeters
