FCCB Meeting Summary – Body of Trustees

Meeting Minutes

Wednesday, March 16, 2022

Present: Bob Meador, Scott Kelly, Carolyn Jones, Mike Snyder, Nathan Loewen, Mike Amos and Nancy Barrett.

Meeting called to order at 9:55am

Opening Prayer: Carolyn Jones

Review of prior meeting minutes: Scott Kelly motioned to approve the minutes as presented and Carolyn Jones seconded, unanimously passed.

1. Financial report presented by John Jolly Treasurer.
 - a. January tithings have been captured in the February deposits and now reflect a \$27K positive figure over expenses.
 - b. Great efforts have been made in reducing Marked Funds and putting them to work for the church, only 3 remain unresolved.
 - c. Discussion was held concerning weekly deposits and how we can get them deposited the Monday after Sunday service. This would better serve the congregation and bring the monthly financials in line.
2. Building and Grounds update presented by Bob Meador.
 - a. Bob requested a credit card with a \$1,000 limit for the maintenance man. It was agreed the maintenance man should have a credit card and will be issued one with the requested limit. David MacInnes will process the paperwork.
 - b. Youth house (Beach Barn) finances are on tract. The CFR funds will be sufficient to complete the project and make the last payment to the builder.
3. David MacInnes has received a request for information on one item. (On travel)
 - a. Request for information concerning the kitchen oven repairs. There was a long discussion, and many questions present concerning the status of repairs of the ovens and the safety of the equipment. It was reported that Bob and Steve have been working on the cleanliness and repairs of the oven. Bob outlined what has been done to date and what is left to complete prior to calling in a company representative. At this point the ovens have been tested and are now coming to the correct cooking temperatures, there is a left door issue that is being resolved now and a full test of the equipment should be able to be run after those repairs. It was decided to continue on the same path we have been on until final repairs are completed. If needed a company representative will be called for final inspection.
4. Beach Barn inspection and punch list update was presented by Carolyn Jones.
 - a. A walk thru was conducted this week for a final punch list of needed repairs prior to accepting the building as complete. This list will be provided to the contractor for repairs. Most repairs are small and should be accomplished quickly by the contractor.

- b. There were a couple of items that cannot be changed or repaired; these are not going to hold up acceptance of the building but will be brought to the building contractor's attention with official church correspondence.
5. Mike Snyder presented several items for review and approval.
- a. A recommendation was presented by Mike to allow the AB Classical Conversations Homeschool Co-op to home base at FCCB. A motion was presented by Scott and seconded by Carolyn and unanimously approved. They will utilize the Coggin building classrooms one day a week starting Aug 2022. A small charge will be assessed to cover supplies and cleaning.
 - b. The AARP tax service will be notified that we will not be able to continue their services going forward due to increased utilization of the campus.
 - c. A recommendation was presented by Mike to allow Becca Cooper to continue as the Children's Director (Sunday/Wednesday); a motion was presented by Scott and seconded by Carolyn, vote carried unanimously.
 - d. A recommendation was presented by Mike to allow Leslie Williams to continue as a permanent hire for the preparation of Wednesday night dinner and to hold a credit card for menu prep. A motion was presented by Scott and seconded by Carolyn; vote carried unanimously.
6. New Business
- a. Nancy Barrett presented and explained an incident at the administration door this last week. There was a long discussion concerning safety and security of the employees and facility in this area. ACS was immediately contacted and some repairs to the electronic locking device was completed. There is still concern for the security and safety of our facility and employees; there are some changes that will be addressed in the upcoming weeks.
7. Nathan closed with prayer.

Meeting was adjourned at 11:15am

Elder's Corner

God Revealed in the Midst of Opposition Acts 13

I am breaking with tradition a little here by combining the Elder's Corner and an update from the Steering Committee. This is not a test to see how many people read the Elder's Corner but is because the new Youth House fits in with the Bible Study I have been working on this week.

If you take a moment to read Acts 13, we find that Paul and Barnabas have set off on their first missionary journey. Prior to heading out, Paul and Barnabas had been in prayer and fasting with the leaders and congregation of Antioch and so were directed by the Holy Spirit. They start off well, but then soon run into opposition. This happens to them again, later in the chapter. In spite of the opposition, their task of spreading the Gospel is still overwhelmingly successful. One would think that being led by the Holy Spirit would have made the job easy. If that were the case, would it have been so clearly seen that God was leading the way? Would they have begun to rely on themselves rather than on God?

This caused me to reflect on the whole process of getting the Youth House built. First, the process for getting the project up and running started well before the pandemic. For some reason, the process of finding and hiring an architect took a lot of time. It seemed to take a lot of time to get a rendering and then plans out of him. He always seemed to be gone. We pushed on in spite of a scary \$1.5 million needed to build. Then the pandemic hit and from then continuing until now, as a church, we have really had some challenges. Talk about opposition!! Yet God continued to bless us and bless the work, Why?

First, I know that many of you and our Church Leaders were praying for God's will for the property on which the Youth House is being constructed. Once we made a determination on what we discerned that God wanted us to do, you all began praying for this project. Finally, you all acted on the promptings that God gave you, whether it be in terms of donations or continued prayers or voicing encouragement and excitement to those of us on the team.

Acts 13 lays out how we can be successful in the main mission of the Church, which is the spreading of the Gospel. When we seek the direction of the Holy Spirit; when we commit ourselves to the will of God and proceed with joy in spite of obstacles; wonderful growth in God's kingdom is accomplished. Now, even though the Youth House is in the final stages of completion, (the punch list will be created the week of March 15), our main mission is still ongoing. We have taken on the task of spreading the Gospel to the youth of the Beaches Community. Your prayers and response to the promptings of God to fulfill this mission will continue to be needed. You have been awesome! We greatly appreciate you all and all you have done.

Don't stop letting the Holy Spirit lead and guide!!

Beaches Community Kitchen (BCC) is a faith-based beaches community ministry supported financially through our Mission monies and volunteers in cooperation with other beach churches as well as the BEAM Food Bank. Using the kitchen of Beach Church in Jacksonville Beach volunteers prepare fresh, nutritious meals three days a week (enough food for six meals) which are then delivered to the frail, elderly, and homebound in the beaches community (Atlantic Beach, Jacksonville Beach, Mayport, and Neptune Beach) by another team of volunteers. We have volunteers on both the cooking and delivery teams.

Want to get involved? Here are some opportunities.

- Need volunteers to help with sorting at the Tuesday Food Prep.
- Need a volunteer operations coordinator to help manage food intake, rotation, and supplies.
- Need a web hosting company to build and help maintain ministry website.
- Need a group to help with meal prep one day a week to give consistent volunteers the day off.
- Need assistance in the kitchen following food prep to clean, organize, and prep for the next day.
- Need people willing to be on a substitute list and help when needed.
- Need a volunteer to take bulk recycling once a week.
- Need a volunteer to pick up and take-home wash towels to launder and return.
- Need help purchasing non-Styrofoam 3 compartment to-go boxes for food deliveries.
